19 regional meetings

that have promoted the articulation and decision making on the IAPA Project and the Amazon Vision, in which the directors and delegates of the National Systems of Protected Areas of the 8 countries and 1 territory have participated.

2 progress reports

on the implementation of the Program of Work on Protected Areas: 2011-2015 and 2016-2017. The latter indicated that by 2017, the Amazon biome has **1.033 protected areas**, representing **33 % of the territory**.

4 thematic groups

consolidated as spaces for experiences exchange and training, through 9 regional meetings, with the participation of 76 officials from the national protected areas systems in the region.



Vulnerability analysis and climate risk of the Amazon biome and its protected areas,

including social criteria, priority conservation areas and species modeling.

in the project landscapes with diverse actors and sectors and 3 meetings at the biome level contribute to consolidate the Amazon Vision.



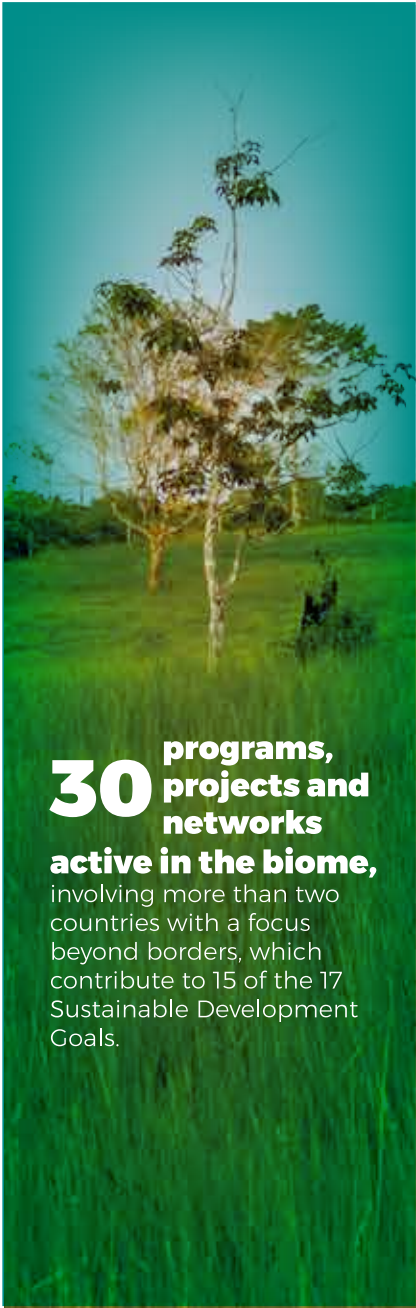

85 local actors

(community leaders, representatives of local governments and officials of protected areas) trained in governance of protected areas, conflict transformation and socio-environmental management in the 2 prioritized landscapes.



More than 200 officials of the systems of protected areas of the 8 countries and the French territory of the biome, contribute to the activities of the Amazon Vision.

2 Trinational-scale landscapes prioritized and with action plans in place, in areas such as governance, shared management of hydrobiological resources, land use planning and sustainable productive activities.
